- The infamous Pendle Hill is associated with the hapless Pendle Witches who were reputedly hidden at The Three Fishes pub before transporting to Lancaster for trial and execution.
- Clitheroe is famous for specialist shops including the famous Byrnes wine shop, The Exchange Coffee Company and Cowman's Butchers.
- The beautiful village of Whalley has a charming Abbey, a wealth of intriguing antique and gift shops and some superb ladies and gents shops including Maureen Cooksons and Cosgroves.
- The stunning landscape around Stonyhurst College is believed to have provided the inspiration for Tolkien's "Middle Earth" in Lord of the Rings.
- Other nearby Heritage attractions include All Hallows Church in Mitton, Clitheroe Castle and Museum, Ribchester Roman Tower, Sawley Abbey and Brownsholme Hall.
