And finally, Louis Roederer's Californian Quartet Brut is probably the finest sparkling wine in the New World. Explore and enjoy this section with confidence.

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FRANCE - ALSACE

Alsace stands apart from the rest of France and has endured a history of mixed ownership, before finally becoming part of the Country at the end of the First World War. Surprisingly, except for the Languedoc, Alsace enjoys the sunniest and driest climate in the whole of France. This is due to its location to the east of the Vosges Mountains, which create a rain shadow for the region.

Alsace was one of the earliest wine regions in France to focus solely on quality (over quantity). It also pioneered the use and promotion of single grape varieties – predominantly white and led by the majestic Riesling. Here is the home to France's greatest range of "aromatic" white wines, with a supporting cast which includes Gewurztraminer, Pinot Gris and Pinot Blanc.

The wines purity of fruit, body, fine acidity and absence of oak means that they are exhilarating partners to food. They unquestionably deserve far greater acclaim than they receive.

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FRANCE – BORDEAUX

Except for Champagne, no other region has managed to build such an enviable reputation through the combination of the high-quality production and hard PR of just a small number of its top producers.

With over 40,000 estates it is an enormous production area and yet it is only the top 2% of Châteaux which carry the imagery and kudos of the region. Nothing would be easier in a Bordeaux section of a wine list than simply selecting a beauty parade of the top names, many of which are now at eye watering prices.

However, we have worked hard to put together a selection of classical, but affordable, wines that combine the best of their individual regions, with many from top vintages and at their peak for drinking. We would especially like to recommend the extensive range of “Second Wines” – we have examples of these from all the main Bordeaux communes on the list. These are all from top estates and selected from younger vines and lots – but their provenance, pedigree and above all drinkability are outstanding.

The section, overall, is geographically structured, by commune, and focused on a selection of “Left Bank” Cabernet Sauvignon based and “Right Bank” Merlot based wines. Left Bank wines tend to be more tannic and structured whilst the Right Bank are slightly softer and more supple, but without any loss of power. Bordeaux, whether red, white or sweet is indisputably a wine made for food – and this echoes the whole ethos at Northcote.

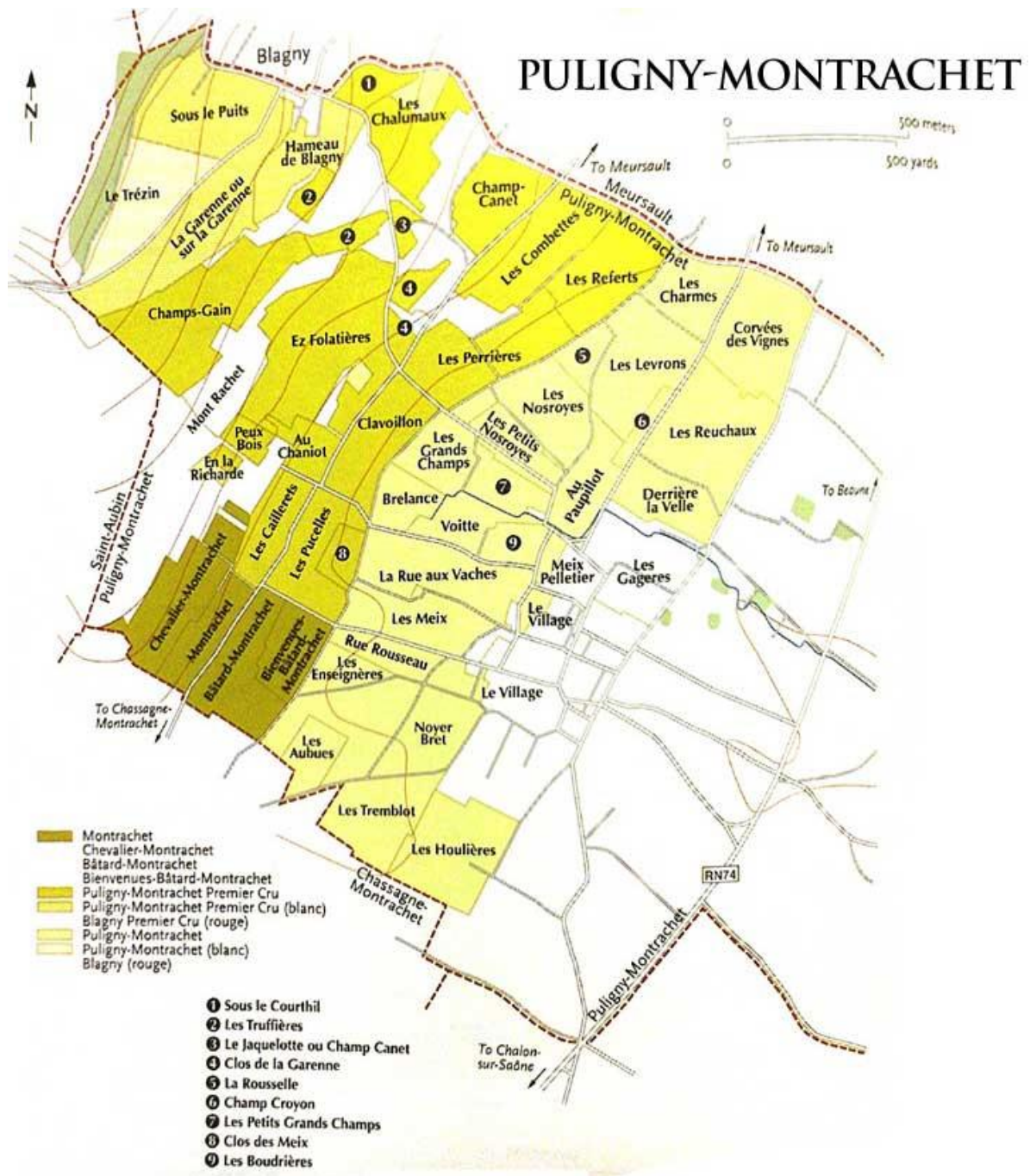

This page should be dedicated to the memory of Anne-Claude Leflaive - proprietor of Domaine Leflaive (Puligny's most famous estate) - who sadly passed away in 2015 at far too young an age. She was the champion of this famous village, as well as obviously her own wonderful estate and wines. She was also a firm advocate of the principles of biodynamism, which she applied in equal measure to her own daily routine, as well as in the vineyards and winery of Leflaive.

In addition to the regal Domaine Leflaive, we have included a fine selection of other well established Domaines and, as importantly, rising stars – most notably Alain Chavy. We also welcome a stunning example from Étienne de Montille from the superb Premier Cru vineyard of le Cailleret. Montille is a highly respected and experienced winemaker and his Domaine (de Montille) is simply one of the finest. He is also in charge of winemaking at the dynamic Château de Puligny-Montrachet, including the entry level wine on this page.

The village of Puligny itself is quietly discreet - in fact only beaten for soporific intensity by its near neighbour Chassagne. There is a sense of surety and tradition which emanates through the narrow streets and this is a place where you feel might be the last to abandon the traditional two hour French lunch sojourn. Only the slightly uncouth bunch of grapes sculpture at the entrance to the village reminds you ostensibly that you are in a true "wine village". Many of the Domaine's hide away in narrow streets and behind unmarked doors and railings.

Within its sparse 111 hectares of vine are 71 different growers and this tells a perverse story. Because there are so few Domaines (proper) most of wine made in the village ends up in the (often particularly good name) bottles of Négociants Puligny, with only a small part of the (paltry) 120,000 cases produced in an average year under top Domaine names.

Within the commune there are 3 distinct physical vineyard bands – from the scree, slate and marlstone of **Combettes** on the Meursault border, which produce some of the more delicate (but never light) and very elegant styles of Puligny. Towards the centre – e.g. **Clavoillon** and **Folatières** - where the soils are deeper and with more clay and limestone you get a firmer and more mineral style. Finally nestling near and around the Grand Crus, the Premier Crus here consist of clay loam and fragmented marl and limestone. Not unsurprisingly, these climates come nearest to the exalted refinement of Grand Crus - led by **Pucelles** and **Caillerets** - with accentuated minerality and intense fruit and floral notes.

Within our selection is also a mixed range of what would be termed "house" styles – with the wines of Sauzet being the most delicate and refined, for example. Château Puligny-Montrachet are always punchy and precise, and Carillon maybe the more opulent. The Grand Cru trio are very special – Leflaive's Bâtard is benchmark rich and textural in style, Jadot's Chevalier piercing and mineral - and Drouhin's mighty Le Montrachet as Puligny in style as this exalted Grand Cru can be. And there are a number of fine bottle aged, mature examples to indulge in – a number of them no longer available on the open market.

It is only fitting that Domaine Leflaive is also well represented. This stellar estate remains the benchmark in terms of quality, intensity and panache - and is a fitting salute to Anne-Claude Leflaive. This remains a page for the purist and hedonist alike and the chance to indulge in the finest expression of the Chardonnay grape in the world.

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FRANCE – LOIRE VALLEY

The Loire is France's longest river (at over 1,000 kms) and probably its most beautiful – no wonder it was the holiday home of the pre revolution aristocracy and why they built over 300 grand Châteaux along its banks. So much so, that in 2000, UNESCO added the central part of the Loire to its list of World Heritage Sites.

With its more marginal, northerly climate the Loire is home to some of the most elegant and racy white wines in the world, although it also produces underrated sparkling, red and rosé wine. With over 87 wine producing areas there is much to choose from. The most famous of these are probably Sancerre (and its near neighbour Pouilly Fumé), which are the spiritual homes of Sauvignon Blanc, and Vouvray – the home of Chenin Blanc, which makes a complete range of styles from bone dry to succulently sweet. Tucked away in this vinous vein of France are numerous rarefied delights, such as Savennières, Jasnières, (sweet) Coteaux du Layon (red) Chinon and one of the UK's long term restaurant allies – Muscadet.

FRANCE – RHONE VALLEY

The Rhône River is not the longest in France it is arguably the most important. The Rhône was the very gateway by which the Romans brought the vine into France and, from there, introduced it across the country.

As this majestic river sweeps through Lyon, it starts its twisted journey into the heart of the wine country. Precipitous granite vineyards hug the river – from the roasted slopes of Côte-Rôtie, past Condrieu before turning around the famous hill of Hermitage. Tiny though these vineyards are it is the very heart of this Appellation and the spiritual home of the Syrah (and Viognier) grape. The reds of this area are, at their best, the most richly structured and refined style.

To the south the river the landscape softens and its pinnacle is indisputably found at Châteauneuf-du-Pape. Here the great red grape of the southern Rhône – Grenache – is at its zenith and these fine wines rival the best of the northern Rhône. With their bold red fruit compote and Indian spice flavours, they are completely different in style, but just as good and – as with the wines of the North – perfect partners for classical main and full-bodied dishes.

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Châteauneuf-du-Pape is one of France's most famous wine regions – and examples from the top producers in great years are some of the finest wines in the world, let alone France. But this is where the caveat lies with this area.

To put this into context Châteauneuf-du-Pape alone produces more wine in an average vintage (usually around 1 million cases) than the whole of the Northern Rhône put together. Not surprising when you consider the region covers an area of over 3,200 hectares (8,000 acres).

With over 320 estates and 180 wineries – plus a complex soil and micro climate patchwork, it is no surprise that the styles, quality and consistency of the wines can be variable. There is no formal hierarchy or classification system for any of the single vineyards or estates, so an understanding of which estates and producers are considered the finest is important.

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Loosely translated the names means “The Pope’s new castle”, which refers to the time when Pope Clement V established the papacy in nearby Avignon (in 1308) and built the (now semi derelict) castle. The wines were known in the UK as early as the 1700’s when it was sold as “Vin d’Avignon”. When Phylloxera wiped out the region (as with most of France) in the 1870s the wines disappeared. As the region gradually recovered, much of the production was historically sold to Burgundy to “fortify” both the colour and strength of these wines. In 1936 it finally defined itself fully as an AOC delimited area and the modern epoch of the region and its wines began. Today Châteauneuf-du-Pape can be either red or white (no rosé is allowed) but most of wine is red.

One of the most often referred to facts about the area is the potential use of 13 different grape varieties (18 if you allow colour variants) – so here they are in alphabetical order:

Bourboulenc/ Cinsault/ Clairette (Blanche/ Rosé) / Counoise/ Grenache (Noir/Blanc/Gris) / Mourvèdre/ Muscardin/ Picardan/ Picquepoul (Blanc/Gris/Noir) / Roussanne/ Syrah/ Terret Noir/ Vaccarèse

By far the three most important varieties for (red) Châteauneuf-du-Pape are **Grenache, Syrah** and **Mourvèdre**. Of these Grenache is the single, most important variety – classically portrayed in pictures as gnarled, old, quasi bonsai plants set amongst large “galets” pudding stones. In truly arid, “boot camp” growing conditions yields are naturally restricted and stress tested vines produce amazing levels of concentration and flavour.

Occasionally Grenache operate as a solo performer – most famously at the revered estate of **Château Rayas** – which we highlight with magnificent older vintage on the list. But in most other top examples it is blended with a judicious amount of Syrah and Mourvèdre – creating an exotic cocktail of red fruits, Indian spices, liquorice and liqueur like qualities; and always with limited reference to, or need for, oak.

It is also worth noting that when top Châteauneuf-du-Pape passes its 10th birthday in the bottle it takes on truly glorious, savoury dimensions which are simply thrilling.

Gold panning through the plethora of producers we have sifted some benchmark examples – and through the excellent cellar planning of the outstanding **Wright Wine Company** - some beautifully mature vintage examples as well - to highlight a few...

The famous **Château de Beaucastel** typifies the richer style with a larger than average proportion of Mourvèdre. Their prestige **Cuvée Hommage à Jacques Perrin** – a blend dominated by Mourvèdre - is simply one of the greatest of all Châteauneuf-du-Pape. **Vieille Julienne** is one of the most balanced and refined styles along with the great **Vieux Télégraphe** – with fruit mainly from the famous sub district of La Crau - exemplifies every fruit and spice interplay which defines the region. We also include the fabulous **Domaine du Pegau** – now one of the most sort after estates – and their benchmark Cuvée.

A little twist in the tale is that this famed red wine area also makes a little white wine – of real weight and style. Again, usually, a multi blend, such as **Roussanne, Grenache Blanc** and **Clairette**, it is as rich and textural, if different in flavour, as a fine white Burgundy. We lead with arguably the finest proponents of this style – again the renowned **Château de Beaucastel (Blanc)**.

Often overlooked in favour of Bordeaux, Burgundy and Rhône, Languedoc-Roussillon provides a vast diversity in styles of wine ranging from still, sparkling, dry through to lusciously sweet Vin Doux Naturel.

Thanks to the flexibility of the Vin de Pays classification, producers have the freedom and opportunity to experiment with different grape varieties such as Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon, Chardonnay and Viognier; all successful across France but displaying the unique style and warmth from this Southerly Mediterranean region.

Carignan, Mauzac and "Piquepoul" are indigenous to the area and surely define Languedoc-Roussillon as a classic French wine region.

Languedoc-Roussillon can offer a wine fit for any occasion and their wines can enhance many a meal. Elegant seafood and poultry dishes work beautifully with the freshness of Picpoul de Pinet. Hearty and rich red meat dishes are outstanding with Minervois. Sweet desserts and cheeses work wonderfully with Vin Doux Naturel.

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ITALY

When thinking of Italy immediate images of rugged beauty, sunburnt terracotta, vast fields of olive trees and an amazing diversity of wine styles and regions come to mind. And no wonder when you consider that this bizarrely shaped country stretches from parallel with Burgundy in the North to touching North Africa in the South.

Between these points lie nearly 400 defined wine regions (DOC or DOCG), 120 IGT (generic production areas akin to Vin de Pays in France), and well over 100 different grape varieties to play with. No wonder trying to understand Italy, vinously, has been described as like nailing jelly to a wall! The good news is that we have done the hard work and focused on what matters most – the quality and typicity of the wine in bottle and their ability to marry with food. And can there be any other country (apart from France perhaps) where the marriage of food and wine is more prevalent than in Italy. Spectacularly diverse reds are rightly regarded as universal partners to most savoury and fuller bodied dishes, apart from the obvious pasta tango. However, it is the white wines of Italy which have come on by leaps and bounds in the last twenty years and are now at the forefront of refreshing drinking allied to new partners for entrée and lighter courses.

Like Burgundy the quality of the producer is vital and we have selected a cross section of the very best and each showcases the combination of their winemaking talents with beautiful expressions of their vineyard origins. The length and breadth of the country is covered and you just might find this the most exciting set of wines on the whole list.

SPAIN

Today, when studying the wines of Spain, you are looking at no more than a snapshot, such is the pace at which the country's wine industry is changing. This is somewhat of a paradox when you consider how old the history of wine is here. More ironic still when you realise that Spain has more land planted under vine than any other country in Europe, even if it produces less volume of wine than Italy or France. This spirit has infected most areas, including some of the more traditional such as Rioja and Ribera del Duero. Here, fruitier and more refined oaked reds are being produced – and even Chardonnay and Sauvignon Blanc are being allowed in the blend of Rioja whites!

The evidence of the pace of change is in the number of new DOs (or defined regions of origin) which have emerged in the last few decades. Amongst these the crisp, tantalisingly fruity, lighter bodied and seafood friendly wine of Rías Baixas are of note, contrasted by the mighty reds of Priorat where gnarled old vine Garnacha (Grenache) and Cariñena (Carignan) make Spain's most hedonistic reds. All the reds of Spain are made for food – and bold food flavours, in general.

Finally, please do not forget Sherry – uniquely Spanish and simply the greatest white fortified wine in the world. Kick any preconceptions and stereotypical images into the long grass – dry Sherry, along with Champagne, is the ultimate aperitif – but also remarkably food friendly, especially with any fish, which is smoked or has a shell on it. The richer Amontillados and Olorosos are dreamy accompaniments to white cheese and refined soups.

AUSTRALIA

If you were to place Australia on top of Western Europe, it would stretch from Ireland in the west to cover Turkey in the east and from Sweden in the north, to North Africa in the south. This vast island is dominated by remote, wild and desert conditions with people – and vines – living almost exclusively on main coastal points.

The modern Australian wine industry only really emerged in the 1970s, and today, Australia is the 4th largest exporter of wine with over 60 designated wine producing regions and 2,000 producers. The vast majority of these are found in the South-East corner, although fine wines are also made around Perth in Western Australia. The most important area is South Australia, followed by Victoria and New South Wales, although there are many new and exciting areas emerging – such as Tasmania.

Plantings are dominated by Shiraz (aka Syrah), Cabernet Sauvignon and Chardonnay, with top Shiraz, commanding worldwide attention and reputation. This includes developing a worldwide reputation for the best New World Rieslings, from the Clare Valley in particular. The most important development, in many ways, has been the trend for vines to be planted in cooler areas and for more refined and food friendly styles to be produced as a result. Other examples of these include Eden Valley in the Barossa, Polish Hills in Clare Valley and Mornington Peninsula in Victoria.

As ever with finer wines it is as much about the producer as the area and the focus of the new selection on the Northcote list is to combine the best of both aspects, whilst providing full scope for food and wine pairing.

NEW ZEALAND

It is remarkable to think that the modern New Zealand wine industry is no more than 40 years old. Back in the early 1970's the world was captivated by the vibrant and mouth-watering flavours they discovered in the new style Sauvignon Blancs from the Marlborough region. Now these wines are recognised as one of the world's classic styles.

Since then, the whole industry has moved on at lightening and diverse pace and the reputation of New Zealand has installed itself as one of the finest and, above all, purist producers in the world. Because of their relatively marginal climate these wines are simply the most food friendly of all to come out of the New World.

Top Sauvignons are now more sophisticated than ever, being very refined and mineral, whilst their Pinot Noirs, have attained world class stature and today challenge Burgundy head on in quality, if different in style. This is also the land of exhilarating aromatic white varieties, led by Pinot Gris, and Riesling.

And Marlborough may no longer be the pre-eminent region – there are now over a dozen high quality, specifically designated wine regions – each gaining reputations for key varieties and styles. Examples include the fast-emerging Marlborough neighbour Nelson (for refined whites and classical Pinot Noir), Central Otago (for richly textured Pinot Noir) and Martinborough for Pinot Noir and Gris. Not unsurprisingly world class producers have emerged – two model examples being Felton Road, who's Pinot Noirs set the industry standard alongside Ata Rangi, who also make what might just be the best Pinot Gris out of the New World.

SOUTH AFRICA

It may come as a surprise, but South Africa has the oldest winemaking tradition and heritage of any New World country, with the first vintage being produced in 1659! By 1685 the famous Constantia estate was established by the Governor of the Cape – Simon van der Stel – and it was he who first produced the world-famous Vin de Constance.

Due to its political isolation, South Africa spent much of the C20th as small scale and rather introspective, but since the collapse of the Apartheid regime in the 1990s the wine industry has emerged as one of the most dynamic players in the New World – now in the top 10 of all the world's wine producers.

Whilst the coolest region is Constantia, along with Walker Bay, the largest and arguably most famous is Stellenbosch, which lies more inland – and with over 50 different soil types it is not surprising that a complex range of white and red wines are made – including fine examples of Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, red Bordeaux blends, as well as South Africa's ubiquitous white grape Chenin Blanc.

Further inland famous areas include Paarl (with its sub districts of Wellington) and Swartland, focusing on the production of mainly red wines – including some outstanding developments with Syrah (aka Shiraz) and other Rhône varieties. Increasing focus and investment has also taken in South Africa's cooler areas and in the use of altitude to promote extended growing seasons and more complex flavours in the grapes. Examples include – and to watch out for – Walker Bay and Elgin in Overberg.

South Africa constantly claim that they – of all New World wines – are the half-way house between the Old and New World in style and structure – in which case they make for perfect partners for a wide range of dishes and foods.

However, you cannot finish an introduction to this country without a mention of its own home-grown red grape – Pinotage. A true “love it or hate it” variety it is a unique part of South Africa's rich vinous canvass.

USA

There is a winemaking paradox in this vast area as when we talk about United States we inevitably think, or say, "California". Pragmatically this State, in effect, operates like a country. Well over half the size again of the UK, if California were a country, it would have the 8th largest economy in the world! And practically, 90% of all wine made in the USA comes from California.

But this only tells half the story because of all the New World areas California is home to the most technically obsessed and focused wine makers in the world. Here they religiously strive to challenge Old World classics and make wines which are very European in structure if very New World in style. As a result, nearly all these wines are made to go with food – led notably by Cabernet Sauvignon/Bordeaux blends and classic barrel fermented Chardonnays. Also, and not least, this is the one area of the New World which challenges New Zealand's reputation for top quality – and stylistically very Burgundian – Pinot Noirs.

One notable exception to this statement on the list is the superb aperitif, bottle fermented sparkler Quartet, made by the renowned Champagne house of Louis Roederer from the cool climate Anderson Valley. It is considered by many to be the finest sparkling wine outside of Champagne.

Having said all of this, to the north of the State are two emerging regions – Washington State and Oregon. Oregon has rightly built a superb reputation for its Pinot Noir and again – surprise, surprise - we see French investment in the form of the renowned Burgundian house of Joseph Drouhin.

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ARGENTINA

By contrast **Argentina** has a much more modern wine history and it is only in the last 25 years that it has established a presence on the world stage. On the other side of the Andes, it does not benefit from any cooling Pacific influences – in fact, the central valleys here are like furnaces in the summer. Argentina's trick has been to counter this by becoming upwardly mobile – and planting vines up into the cooler mountain atmosphere – often to altitudes of over 10,000 feet! This approach has created a range of more refined wine styles for both red and white – exemplified by their highly perfumed, crisp and fruity unoaked white from the Torrontés grape. But it is probably the hedonistically robust red Malbec grape (a former favourite in Bordeaux out of interest) where they have built their reputation – and especially those from the Mendoza region, which claims to be the single largest continuous expanse of vines anywhere in the world!

The keynote for South American wines these days – both red and white – is their sense of vitality and bold expressive fruit. Because of the increasing amount of time, expertise and investment being made into making wines in more refined viticultural areas they are consistently well structured and this balance between exuberance and restraint makes them natural and highly enjoyable partners to food.

CHILE

Chile is a remarkable country. 2,700 miles long and no more than 110 miles wide it goes from the driest place on earth in the north (The Atacama Desert) to Antarctic Glaciers in the south. Not unsurprisingly, it is in the main central belt where all the great wine areas are found. With the Andes to the East and the cool waters of the Pacific Ocean to the West, the whole country is quite isolated, which has contributed to some of the coolest, purest and most naturally organic growing conditions in the Southern Hemisphere. To this day **all** vines are grown on their own rootstock, for example.

About 75% of wine produced is red, and this is dominated by the Bordeaux varieties – Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. However, in recent years, increasingly emphasis is being given to developing cool climate areas for vines - such as Casablanca and Leyda Valleys and here pungent Sauvignon Blancs challenge the best out of New Zealand. In recent years Chile has also become famous for its “home grown”, ripe and spicy red grape – Carmenère – a grape considered to work especially well with spicy and curried foods.
